

Cheritonwood : ex Rosebank

This house is right at the top of Ann Street. It was originally called Rosebank but the present owners have renamed it **Cheritonwood**.



The “Old Military Road” came into Gatehouse through the ground on which this house is built. The Cut was opened in 1823, Rosebank was feued in 1828, and at about the same time the street became known as Ann Street.

Rosebank was feued by Alexander Murray in 1828 to Jane McNish (1779-1851), widow of John McCartney (1775-1819) of the island of New Providence. Jane’s eldest brother was James McNish (1766-1812) owner of the Cairnsmuir Plantation, Jamaica. William McNish (1770-1828) owned the Gatehouse plantation in Georgia; another brother John McNish (1780-1826) owned the Hermitage plantation. When Jane died in 1851, Rosebank was inherited by her sister Christina, wife of William McClure. She sold it in 1854 to Horatio Murray Stewart, after which it became the Cally factor’s house until it was sold to Alexander McMillan, farmer, Irelandton on Mr Murray Stewart’s death in 1904.
