Remembrance Sunday in Gatehouse

On the Sunday nearest to 11th November each year, the Royal British Legion organise a ceremony at the Girthon & Anwoth War Memorial.

This is preceded by an ecumenical service in Gatehouse & Borgue Parish Church (formerly Girthon Parish Church). It is open to be attended by all faiths as well as representatives from the British Legion, scouts and firemen.

Just before 11a.m. the congregation, led by the standard bearers and usually a piper, make their way from the church to the War Memorial for the '2 minutes silence', the laying of wreaths, and the playing of the last post.

Jimmy Gilmour, a local builder, first played the Last Post on his cornet at the ceremony in 1953 and continued every year for 44 years. He was a member of the Gatehouse 'I'll Mak Siccar' Band and latterly the Creetown Silver Band.
