

## 11 Fleet Street



### ◀ Chronology of Ownership & Occupancy ▶

**1794** Initial feu of 20ft to John Papple, surgeon in Gatehouse. Papple also feued a plot of land with 100ft frontage onto Fleet Street where he planned to construct a new mill. Economic conditions changed, his business venture failed, and he sold the land in 1798 for construction of house nos. 25, 27 & 29.

*John McClure is mentioned but we think this is in relation to his ownership of no.13/15 next door*  
**1830** Thomas Ewart grocer and tea dealer, Peterborough.

**1859-60 Anwoth Valuation Roll :** Thomas Ewart, Peterborough, England owned property in Gatehouse, but each has rent < £4 p.a. so tenants are not named. Info per D J Ewart, writer, Gatehouse.

**1912-13 Anwoth Valuation Roll :** William Aked, retired, is occupying a house in Fleet Street that is owned by Jessie D Campbell, spinster who lived in Fleet Street.

**1924** Sold by Jessie Dykes Campbell to William Kerr, gamedealer, Fleet Street for £130.

**1936** Bond for £250 by Norval Hughan from William Kerr. Repaid 1942.

**1940-41 Anwoth Valuation Roll :** Norval M Hughan, Drumwall, Gatehouse, owned the house at 11 Fleet Street which was occupied by Jas. H Shaw, motor driver.

**1942** Sold by Norval Hughan to Robert Frew and passed to his daughters.

**1950** Sold by Margaret Frew and Grace Frew to John Kirk and spouse.

**1950-51 Anwoth Valuation Roll :** John Kirk owned and occupied the house at 11 Fleet Street.

**1960-61 Anwoth Valuation Roll :** Agnes H Kirk, widow, owned and occupied the house at 11 Fleet Street.

**1976** Sold by Curator Bonis of William Kirk to Robert Armstrong, Barharrow.

**1989** Sold to Helen Greggan.
