**1794** [Andrew Watt was aged 74 in 1841 and was the lint miller living at Skyreburn Waulk Mill. With him were his wife Hannah and his children Charles & Janet.]

**1863** Charles Watt drowned in the Skyreburn river in 1863, after which his sister Janet inherited 17 Fleet Street. She probably lived there until she died, unmarried in 1867.

**1867** After the death of Janet Watt, her nephew George Darling Watt (son of her oldest brother James) inherited 17 Fleet Street. **George had been the 1<sup>st</sup> convert to Mormonism to be baptised in the British Isles.** He was born in Manchester in 1812 and had emigrated to Utah in about 1850.

**1912-13 Anwoth Valuation Roll :** James McClellan, police constable, Glasgow, owned a house in Fleet Street that was occupied by Elizabeth Harriet McClellan, widow.

**1921-22 Anwoth Valuation Roll :** Elizabeth Harriet McClellan, widow, owned and occupied a house in Fleet Street.

**1921** James McClellan, motor transport driver, inherited from his father James McClellan, grocer's assistant, later grocer (died 1906)

**1921** James McClellan passed the property to his mother Elizabeth Agnew.

**1930-31 Anwoth Valuation Roll :** Elizabeth Harriet McClellan, widow, owned and occupied a house in Fleet Street.

**1940-41 Anwoth Valuation Roll :** Elizabeth Harriet McClellan, widow, owned and occupied the house at 17 Fleet Street.

**1946** James McClellan inherited from his mother Elizabeth Agnew Shedden or McClellan

**1950-51 Anwoth Valuation Roll :** James S McClellan, labourer, owned and occupied the house at 17 Fleet Street.

**1952** Harry McClellan, postman, 57 High Street inherited from his brother James Shedden McClellan, labourer

**1954** Sold to Walter McCulloch

**1960-61 Anwoth Valuation Roll :** Major Walter J McCulloch owned 17 Fleet Street, which was occupied by Jas. MacKenzie, estate worker.

**1988** Sold by Cordia Company Limited to Susan Robinson

**1991** Sold by Susan Robinson to Howard Fazerkley
