◀ Chronology of Ownership & Occupancy ▶

1794	Initial feu to John Pape [37ft 3in], surgeon in Gatehouse, as part of a plot of land with 100ft frontage onto Fleet Street. He planned to construct a new mill, but economic conditions changed, his business venture failed, and he sold the land in 1798 for construction of house nos. 23, 25, 27 & 29. Nos 23, 25 & 27 became the property of Samuel McMillan, merchant in Gatehouse.
1795	Passed to John Napier, trustee upon the sequestrated estate of John Pape.
1796	Sold to John Thomson, junior
1798	Sold to John Hornsby, bricklayer in Gatehouse
1799	Sold to Samuel McMillan, merchant in Gatehouse
1830	Disposition and settlement of Samuel McMillan to his son W D McMillan. (repeated in 1843).

1921-22 Anwoth Valuation Roll : William McConnel, solicitor, Gatehouse was proprietor of 2 houses in Fleet Street. One was empty and the other was occupied by Henry Johnstone, retired.

1930-31 Anwoth Valuation Roll : William McConnel, solicitor, Gatehouse was proprietor of a shop in Fleet Street that was empty and a house that was occupied by Isabella Craig, spinster.

1940-41 Anwoth Valuation Roll : William McConnel, solicitor, Gatehouse was proprietor of a shop in Fleet Street that was empty and a house that was occupied by Janet Craig, spinster.

1943 Sold by heir of John Hunter to Andrew Crosbie via executor William McConnel.

1943 Sold to Ada Chapman
