No McKinnell or Torrance in Anwoth in 1841. The above would seem to be the first two families on the north side of Fleet Street after the enumerator has completed the south side having started at Boatgreen.

No Torrance in Anwoth. There was a Jannet McKinnel, a 36-yr-old widow who was a cook at Ardwall House. The ages are quite different, but Agnes Redfern from Ireland occupied this property in 1841 and Fleet Street 21 is consistent with starting the numbering down the south side at Boatgreen before crossing the road and then moving to the north side.

- 1859** Janet McKinnell or Dalrymple, wife of Thomas Dalrymple woodcutter, was heir of William McKinnell, mason,

following life rent of her mother Agnes Torrance or McKinnell. Thomas Dalrymple was being pursued by James Hornsby, grocer who was owed £42 by Thomas Dalrymple between 1845 and 1857, therefore disposed to Hornsby in security. Hornsby also got disposition of a property in Back Street owned by William McKinnell, shoemaker son of William McKinnell, mason. Debt repaid 1860.

1859-60 Anwoth Valuation Roll

Mrs Agnes McKinnell, of Back Street, owned property in Gatehouse at which individual rents did not exceed £4 p.a., so tenants are not named.

Fleet Street 20 is the first property after Riverside coming into town. The number of families between Riverside and Garden Street suggest there are at least 2 families in several buildings.

1912-13 Anwoth Valuation Roll

May Macauley, spinster, owned 3 properties in Fleet Street that were occupied by (1) Elizabeth Goudie, widow; (2) John Little, carter; and (3) Robert Davidson, fisherman.

No Elizabeth Goudie lived in Anwoth per 1911 census. The same census suggests that John Little lived at no.2 Fleet Street. Macauley's seem to own both 39 & 41 Fleet Street at this time (maybe the same person?).

1916 Sold by Agnes Macaulay to Janet Belford.

1922 Sold to Robert Brown, contractor, Dallas, Texas.

1960-61 Anwoth Valuation Roll :

Thomas McKinna and Janet A McKinna owned and occupied 41 Fleet Street.

1968 Title of Janet McKinna, widow.

1989 Passed to Muriel McKinna or McIlwraith.
