Samuel HUNTER and Catherine McMILLAN are great grandparents of Margaret WRIGHT (née HUNTER). Samuel and Catherine are identified ex son James’ birth, marriage and death certificates. We have a transcribed copy of their marriage certificate and a photograph of their gravestone in Kirkbean Churchyard. Samuel’s birthdate is in the Hunter family bible, but this cannot be confirmed in the Dalry OPR records which were lost for many years. Catherine’s birthdate and christening came from the Dunscore OPR. Both dates of death come from the gravestone inscription. We have transcribed copies of Samuel’s and Catherine’s death certificates. Hunter family bible gives Catherine’s birthdate as 7/10/1833, OPR gives birthdate 10-11-1833 and christening date as 08-12-1833, but this also gives her father as James, whilst family bible and her marriage and death certificates + 1841 census all give father = John.

Samuel married age 30 in 1863, and was aged 39, 47, & 57 per 1871, 1881 & 1891 New Abbey censuses. Catherine married age 29, and aged 38, 47 & 55 in 1871 to 1891 censuses. All the children’s birthdates ex Hunter family bible, as were Samuel, Catherine, James, Fredrick and 1st Margaret’s death dates. We have a transcribed copy of James’ birth certificate. Samuel was head joiner at Cavens Estate for 40 years. John was also a joiner at Cavens sawmill, Drumburn and later at Kindar Lodge, New Abbey before moving to Carlisle where he is buried. Kate was for a long time engaged but never married and she stayed at Drumburn until her mother died in 1910, and then she trained as a maternity nurse. Kate & Betty moved to share a house at 15 Fleet Street (Bennachie) in Gatehouse when they retired and are both buried at Anwoth Churchyard. Kate died in Kirkcudbright Hospital. Betty was a dressmaker, she died in 1944 whilst sitting by the roadside waiting for a bus at Cardoness shore (at Lanefoot) near Gatehouse. Margaret L & her family emigrated to Australia. We have transcribed death certificates for the 1st Margaret Laing, for Kate jnr, and for Betty In 1851 Catherine was a maid (aged 17) at Rue, Holywood, Dumfries for McMurray family. Frederick is spelt Fredrick ex family bible and Fredreck on Kirkbean gravestone. His death appears in the Dumfries and Galloway Standard and we have a transcribed copy of his death certificate.

Both Margarets were named after their maternal grandmother. The younger one kept house for her brother James in Gatehouse until both James and Margaret were married in 1904.

 John was living in Blackburn at the time of his marriage as he was a joiner working on the erection of the stands to Ewood Park (Blackburn Rovers)
 Children's dates of birth by David MacMILLAN, as were dates of death for Kate, Elizabeth and Helen. Deaths of James & David ex Kathleen ASHTON (d. of James HUNTER)
 Bessie HUNTER death ex Barbara WYNN. Bessie's birth date from notice in Dumfries & Galloway Standard dated 19 – 06 – 1894. Also Kate's death notice (20 – 01 – 1894).
 Notes ex David MacMILLAN :
 John was regarded as the best looking of the Hunters of Drumburn. He was a joiner at the Caven's Sawmill in New Abbey. The family moved about 1899 to Kindar Lodge, New Abbey when John started his own joinery business. This business failed and a fellow freemason offered him a job as foreman joiner in Carlisle, and the family moved there in about 1901. He played the fiddle and wrote some Scottish dance music.
 Notes from Kath Ashton :
 Alec and Fred were both unemployed for many years. Fred moved to Manchester in the 1930's to a job arranged by his brother Jim. Fred lived with his brother David and his wife Bessie in Reddish, Stockport. Sam was a ganger involved in track maintenance at Carlisle railway station. Fred & Alec's death dates
 John & Helen Hunter also looked after the 2 children of Sam Houston, Helen's brother after his wife became mentally ill.

James HUNTER & Elizabeth NICOL are paternal grandparents of Margaret WRIGHT (née HUNTER). We have transcribed copies of the birth, marriage and death certificates for James and Elizabeth ex New Register House in Edinburgh. David McMillan, James’ cousin, was best man at their wedding and the reception was held at The Douglas Arms, Castle Douglas.

We have original birth, marriage and death certificates for Arthur Hunter. We have a newspaper cutting announcing Freda’s birth : she was named after James’s brother Frederick. We have transcribed copies of birth certificates for Freda & Nan. Nan was named after Anne Eliza Murray -Stewart, the wife of the Laird at Cally where James & Elizabeth worked. The Hunter family bible gives death dates for James, Elizabeth, Freda and Nan.

In 1899, and at the age of 31, James left Drumburn to take up the post as Clerk of Works on the Cally Estate, with accommodation being provided by his employer at the Sawmill House in Gatehouse. At roughly the same time Elizabeth moved to Gatehouse from Aberdeenshire to nurse Horatio Granville Murray-Stewart, the ageing Laird of Cally.

James was a freemason and an elder at Girthon Parish Church. In 1925 he built Drumaber, a bungalow in Garden St, Gatehouse. In 1929 James & Arthur started their own business as J&A Hunter, joiners and undertakers, based at 6 Catherine St., Gatehouse. Elizabeth was district nurse in Gatehouse for many years.

Freda was a schoolteacher and during her later years taught in Kettering. Nan, a children’s nanny, was cycling with her charges when she was killed in a road accident near Watford. James, Elizabeth and Nan are all buried at Anwoth churchyard, Gatehouse. Freda died in Kettering. Nan’s death certificate no. (Oct- Dec 1942 3a 1230 Watford)

Before marriage, Jim lived at Drumburn and was an NCO with the Galloway Rifles (source David MacMillan). He also had a hobby of keeping and showing poultry.

During WW1 Jim served at the 2 prisoner of war camps on the Isle of Man.

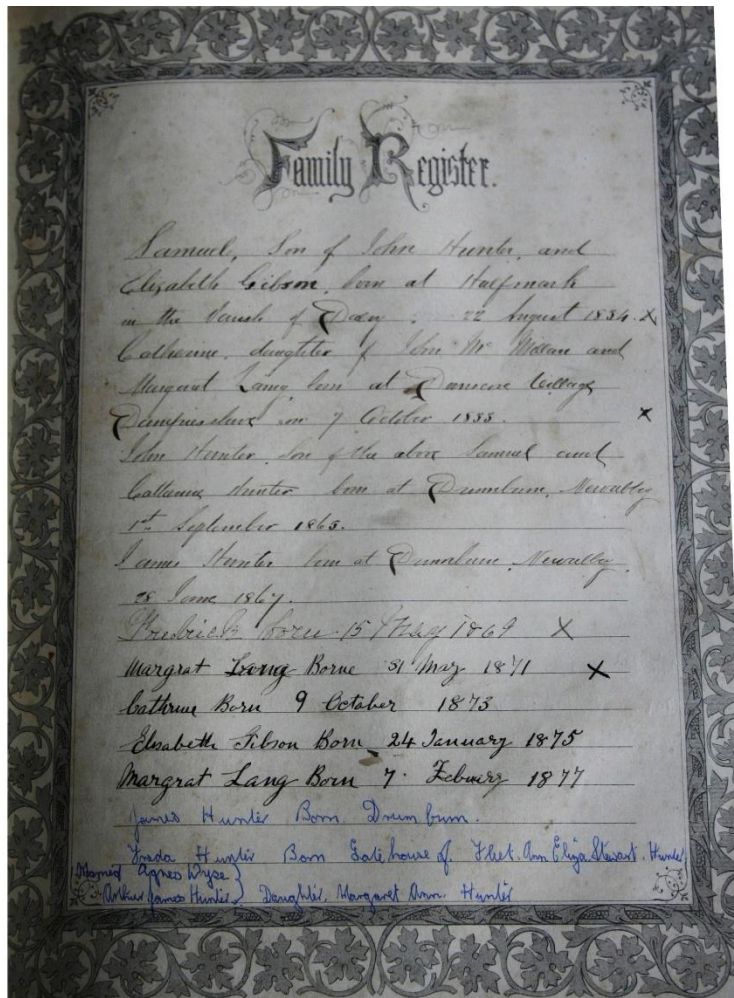

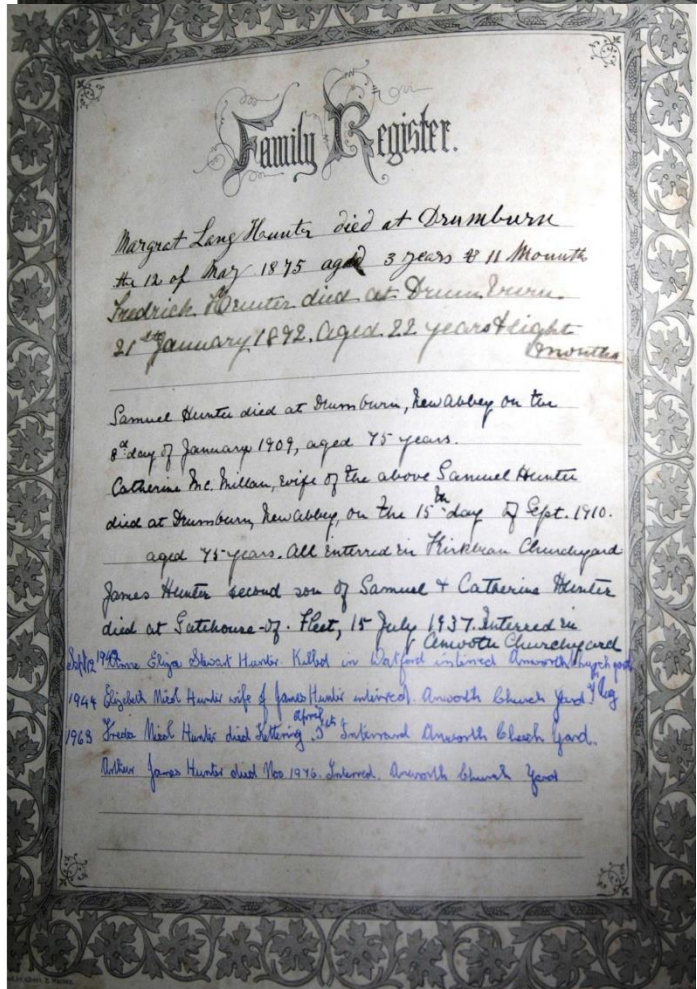

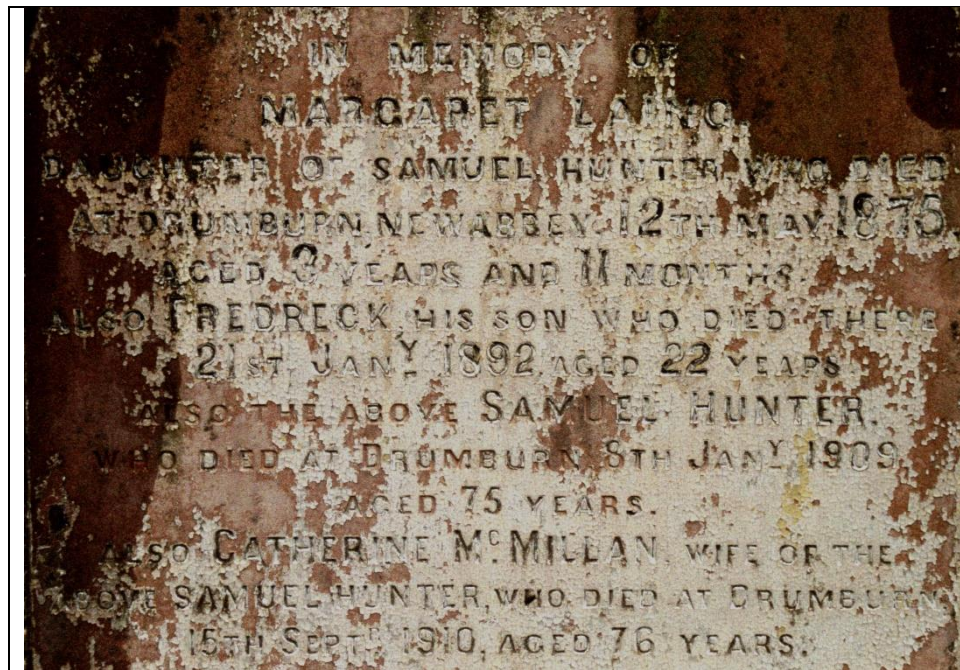
