

Cally Chapel

Horatio Granville Murray Stewart and Anne Eliza Wingfield Digby married in 1858. Anne Eliza's father was Rev. John Wingfield Digby, an Episcopalian minister. His daughter was believed to have been very pious and appreciated the chapel which was added to Cally House in 1877.

Non-residents of Cally House were allowed to use the chapel - Episcopalianism from the surrounding area were encouraged to attend services. Locals, particularly Cally Estate workers, could marry and have their children baptised there.

When Glasgow Corporation used Cally House as a boarding school during World War Two, the chapel was converted into bedrooms for pupils.

The Chapel gradually became structurally unsound and was finally demolished in 1990, 9 years after Cally House was converted to a hotel

Part of the Chapel still survives in Gatehouse. The large stained glass windows were presented to Girthon Parish Church in 1945.
