# Woodside Terrace - Salamanca Cottage

Before "The Cut" was opened in 1823, the road, or turnpike, into Gatehouse from the East came down Ann Street, past the toll-house (now called Cox's Lodge) and continued along Old Ford Road, until it met a ford across the river. Prior to 1823 there was no road between the clock tower and the mill dam(s). Much, if not all, of this land was part of the Murray Arms grounds.

Salamanca was the first house after the Toll House to be built in Woodside Terrace.

# Thomas Plunkett and Salamanca Cottage

- In 1836 a Thomas Plunkett from the Royal Artillery Barracks in Exeter feued the land on which Salamanca Cottage was subsequently built.
- He was an Irishman, born at St.Mary's, Dublin about 1787 (info. ex Exeter 1871 census).
- He enlisted with the 5th Regiment of the Dragoon Guards in 1806. We don't have records of his whereabouts in the army but we believe he fought under the command of the Duke of Wellington in the Peninsula Wars (1808-1814), part of which was the Battle of Salamanca in 1812.
- We have details of Thomas living in Exeter with his wife Elizabeth from the 1841, 1861 & 1871 Exeter census.
- In the 1871 census Elizabeth was aged 70 and her birthplace was Gatehouse, Scotland.
- We could find no marriage of a Thomas Plunkett to an Elizabeth.
- If Elizabeth's age in 1871 was accurate then there was an Elizabeth Mackenzie born in Girthon 14-Apr-1800.
- Thomas died in 1872 and Elizabeth succeeded him for a further 5 years.

Clearly Thomas had an association with Gatehouse as a result of his marriage, and the fact that he named his newly-built house Salamanca Cottage seems to prove his involvement in the Battle of Salamanca, but we have no evidence that he ever lived in Gatehouse.
